



we rented an ice cream truck and drove out to each family with a Shavuot activity (making an edible candy Torah) and Ice Cream and a 4 page brochure about the holiday.




Cake contest

At Mount Sinai, G-d said the 10 Commandments. They are:

- 1. Believe in G-d
- 2. Do not worship idols
- 3. Do not say my name in vain
- 4. Keep Shabbat holy
- 5. Respect your parents
- 6. Do not kill
- 7. Do not commit adultery
- 8. Do not steal
- 9. Do not be a false witness
- 10. Do not be jealous




All our students








Performances:


